Take your litter home

Restriction on vans and trailers lifted

Did you know you can take vans weighing up to 3.5 tonnes to our recycling centres and trailers up to 2 metres long?

Drivers can take vans and trailers up to drop off household waste from their own property as long as they make the trip on the correct day based on the last number on their vehicle registration plate.



Vehicles with 0, 2, 4, 6, or 8 as the last number on their registration plate will be allowed in on even dates in the month. Those with 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 as the last number on their registration plate will be allowed in on odd dates in the month.
