We're urging residents to enjoy summer safely by leaving their contact details when visiting social places.

By doing so you're supporting NHS Test and Trace which means you'll be contacted if someone on the premises tests positive for coronavirus.

When sharing your details make sure you share them fully and clearly, if you don't it makes it harder for contact tracers to alert you.

We're currently appealing to residents of Ilkeston after four people who visited the town's pubs tested positive for coronavirus, but when contact tracers tried to alert customers a significant number had left incomplete or illegible details.

So when you go out to a pub, restaurant, a place of worship or any other venue please leave your contact details and do your bit to help stop the spread.

If you have coronavirus symptoms, don't hesitate, get tested.

Restrictions eased at recycling centres



Did you know you can visit our recycling centres any day of the week?

We've changed the layout of our 9 centres to allow more vehicles on site at any one time while allowing visitors to maintain 2 metre social distancing.

This means the odd and even number plate and queue checking system on our website are no longer in place but queues may still form at busy periods so please be prepared to wait.

Are you wearing your face covering correctly?

We all know by now that unless we're exempt we must wear a face covering in shops, on public transport and in enclosed public spaces to help stop coronavirus spreading and stay on the right side of the law. But there's a few more things we need to remember when we cover up:

- · Your face covering should cover your mouth and nose at all times
- Don't touch the front of it, this part could be contaminated with the virus

New library opens its doors




Our new Belper Library welcomed its first customers last week with the added bonus of being able to browse the shelves for the first time since lockdown.
